The CDD Board of Supervisors would like to welcome all of our new residents to our Baytree family. Our community being older is in transition of having younger families with children which is a great thing to have happen. That being said, there is an issue that I must address, and that is the issue of not obeying the posted speed limit, and stop signs.

Even though there are those residents that do obey the laws, there are those that do not. The posted speed limit within Baytree is 25 MPH with exception of Kingswood and it is 20 MPH due to a narrow street and houses closer together. My wife and I have personally experienced situations where we have been passed or attempted to be passed on Baytree Drive when we were

Want to cut a tree down?
Read this first!

Recently we have received a number of requests to cut down hardwood trees. Many of these requests don't contain a diagram showing the property, location of other hardwoods (note: we do not need or require location of palm trees). The reason we need the diagram is to verify which hardwood you want to remove and the number of other hardwoods that will remain on the property AFTER the tree is removed. This also tells us if the property contains the required (Brevard County requirements) number of hardwoods after the tree is removed. If not, we have to advise the homeowner that another hardwood(s) is required. If we have the diagram, we can advise the homeowner where they might put such a hardwood (not necessarily in the front yard). So help us so we can help you. If you need to take down a hardwood, PLEASE attach the above mentioned diagram to your application.



HURRICANE SEASON:

Its that time of year again....unfortunately. Please take the time to review the following:
Hurricane Panels:
B-PARCS 2.11
Bylaws (Covenants):
Article 13.21.11 Hurricane and Storm Protection

These 2 requirements are strictly enforced. So your familiarity with them is important. Now is also the time to look at your landscape for possible limbs or other items that may come loose and become projectiles. Trim them as soon as you can. Please keep the road gutter in front of your home free of debris to allow rainwater to flow freely to the storm water drains. If one of those drains is in front of your home, be neighborly and try to keep it clear of debris. Again, so rain water can drain freely. The CDD does an annual check to make sure all the drains are functioning properly prior to hurricane season. Finally, if you have outside play equipment such as basketball hoops, be aware that such equipment must be put in your garage if a named storm is pending (B-PARCS 2.10E).

Everyone complying with these tips enhances the safety of protecting our properties during a storm.


Meet David Nowak! New Turnberry Voting Member (VM)

Landscaping Best Practices - Part I

Baytree has a new landscaping company, U.S. Lawns. U.S. Lawns recently held an informative session about landscaping best practices. For those of you that were unable to attend, I will be sharing some of those best practices with you in the next few newsletters. **Today's topic is mulching.**



Over Mulching - This is likely the most common mistake we see. Piling mulch too high and covering a tree's trunk, also known as "volcano mulching," can cause damage to your trees. To be clear, mulch is *great* for trees. Mulch reduces weeds, conserves moisture and improves the soil, which helps your tree stay healthy! But when it comes to mulch, it's possible to have too much of a good thing. When mulch is too high and sits too close to a tree's trunk, it causes two issues that slowly damage your tree over time

Problem: Too much mulch smothers the tree's roots.

Consequence: Roots might grow up through the mulch in search of air. That can cause them to "girdle" or wrap around the trunk, which chokes the tree by cutting off its water supply.

Problem: Moisture builds up.

Consequence: That excess moisture between the trunk and mulch volcano creates perfect conditions for wood decay diseases, like fungi. Plus, deteriorating bark at the tree's base can lead to an unstable foundation.

Correct Mulching - Mulch out, not up! No deeper than the heel of your hand, generally 2-4 inches. Back off from the trunk! Keep all mulch away from the trunk of the tree, allowing the root flare to show just above ground level. Be careful when removing built up mulch. The tree's roots are likely close to the surface and care should be taken to not damage the roots. Mulch to the tree's drip line, if possible! Keep the trunk dry and the roots moist! Use nature as a reference. Look at any tree that grew the grew naturally and you will always see the tree's root flare.
