



ARC Committee Update

One of the issues the Architectural Review Committee (ARC) has seen recently are applications from homeowners to take down a diseased palm tree. If you have a diseased palm tree take it down right away and then submit an application to remove it. DO NOT WAIT. The longer it takes to remove that tree increases the chances of that disease getting spread to other similar palm trees in the community. Whether you replace that palm tree is your choice, especially if you have additional palm trees on your property. (County regulations state that palm trees should equal no more than 25% of the trees on your property, the rest should be hardwoods).





Now that Hurricane Season is ebbing away, it is NOW time for the HOLIDAY SEASON TO BEGIN! This is a much happier time of year when everyone breaks out their holiday lights, tests them, buys more and then starts stringing them up. The season that says my lighting display is better than yours!!

NEW! FYI...Satellite Beach Parking Permits

The City of Satellite Beach now regulates and charges for parking at Pelican Park and Hightower Beach. Parking will remain free for all Brevard County residents, but you must register your vehicle(s). If you don't get a permit, your car tire will likely booted (as pictured).

The process for registering a vehicle is simple and can be done online at the following website: https://www.parksatellitebeach.org/. Go to the website, then click on "ANNUAL PASSES" at the top of the page. If you do not reside within the city of Satellite Beach, but are a resident of Brevard County select the second option "NON-RESIDENT PERMITS (HIGHTOWER AND PELICAN)",

Create an account (this will involve scanning or photographing your vehicle registration, and attaching it to the application). If you are unable to do this, you can go to their office and apply in person. This must be completed in advance of parking (it can take up to 72 hours for approval after submitting the required information). If not completed in advance, any vehicles parking on site will have to pay the daily parking fees. Many of your questions regarding beach parking can also be found on this site. If you are unable to navigate through the site, you can also call the beach parking office at 321-425-2522 or visit the office in person at 476 Hwy A1A, Suite 1-B, Satellite Beach, FL 32937.



For Your Information...

Please Leash Your Dog

Please keep your dogs on leashes when not on your property. Please be aware the maximum legal length of a leash is six (6) feet.

The BCA has recently been contacted by several residents who have issues with dogs not on leashes. The BCA does not have the authority to intervene in these situations, but the **Brevard County Sheriff's Office of Animal Services** can. While no-one wants to get the Sheriff's office involved, residents may call the Sheriff;s Office of Animal Services at 321-633-2024 to get help.
