When you receive a letter please correct the situation or contact Fairway Management and let them know how you will address the issue. As of late we have had people totally disregard the violation letters which results in fines up to \$2000 or legal action for breach of contract.

It was also brought to my attention that two residents who received violation letters contacted Fairway Management and left threatening messages and the use of expletives to the individual responsible for the inspection of the Baytree Community. This is UNACCEPTABLE and will not be condoned. If you have an issue you can contact me or any BCA Board member.

# PLEASE DON'T LEAVE IT AT THE CURB!!

Remodeling and redecorating projects often leave homeowners with usable appliances or gently used pieces of furniture. With a goal of repurposing these items, the solution frequently is to set them at the curb for a passer-by to pick up. This is not only unsightly, but with limited traffic in our gated community, not very successful.

To avoid "clutter at the curb", residents are encouraged to find other solutions. Google lists numerous agencies that will pick up, at no cost, and make the items available for re-use. While Angels in the Attic (321-259-0077) currently only accepts items delivered to their store at 7200 N Wickham Road (the truck is currently not available) the Southern Brevard Sharing Center (321-727-8581) will pick up used furniture. As well as furniture, Habit for Humanity welcomes workable ceiling fans, windows, doors, cabinets, appliances, etc. Call them at 321-728-4009.

When searching for other agencies, Google "furniture donations Brevard County Florida". The list includes private, for hire companies. Others listed are tax exempt so your donation is tax deductible.

If your items are truly no longer usable, Brevard Waste Management will also pick up for free. Call 321-723-4455 for details. Please do not place the items at the curb until you have contacted them.

The Baytree CDD has begun the process of considering new projects and improvement for the Baytree Community. We will be developing a 5 year Plan that would go into effect with the

beginning of fiscal year 2022 (October 1st). Some of the potential projects include:

- Fitness Trail/Path
- Shuffleboard; Pickle ball; Corn hole
- Refurbishment of the Pool deck
- Replacement of the Pool furniture
- Playground features: Swing Set; Dome; Playground
- Playground area (where removed) needs drainage repair and fill dirt
  Replacement of the Pool drinking
- fountain
- Lake bank restoration (on-going)
- Update/replacement of gate transponders
- Roadway repair
- Sidewalk repair

The CDD continues to work through the costs and the budget and will be updating the Community at each meeting and workshop. Please attend the meetings and provide your input. #### WHOSE TREE IS IT ...... ANYWAY?



Many residents have been asking the question, I have an oak tree (or another type of tree) on my property between the sidewalk and the curb. I did not put it there. So whose tree is it?" The answer is.....the tree is owned by the CDD.....But you are responsible to maintain it. That means you are responsible to trim it. The first branches cannot be less than 12 feet off the street (to allow large vehicles to pass under without hitting a branch) and high enough off the sidewalk (12 feet) to allow other residents to easily walk underneath it without hitting their heads on a branch. Very important this time of year as many residents enjoy walking in the cooler weather.

That being said, you also have the right to cut roots out of any tree that is impacting any underground utility lines on your property(sewer, electric, gas, cable). Any roots from these trees between the sidewalk and the curb that are raising your sidewalk or driveway should be brought to the attention of the CDD Management Company (GMS at 407-841-5524, ask for Jason Showe). If it is determined that those roots are causing damage to your driveway and/or sidewalk, the tree will be removed by the CDD.....that is NOT your responsibility. The CDD will also repair or replace the sidewalk if necessary, but you are responsible for your driveway. So, if you observe something from the tree between the sidewalk and the curb that

may become a problem (sidewalk or driveway) bring it to the attention of the CDD Management Company *right away.* All the other trees on your property are your responsibility. There is a lot of helpful information in our Architectural Guidelines (B-PARCS) and are available for you to review on our website.



### LETTERS, WE GET LETTERS

For those of you that remember the Perry Como Show you may recall this part of his program.....Letters, we get letters, we get lots and lots of letters.....

Well, it seems we all get letters from Fairway Management following their regular inspections informing us that our property is not meeting B-PARCS requirements. In an effort to decrease the number of letters sent, listed below are the TOP 5 homeowner infractions noted over the past 12 months:

- Unclean sidewalks and driveways
- Unclean exterior of home and/or roof
- Weeds in the lawn/driveway and unkempt landscaping
- Trees needing trimming

Let's all take note of these items on a regular basis and reduce the number of violation letters sent to residents.

# Baytree DECARATIONS and COVENANTS.

Baytree standards can seem restrictive, but when equitably enforced they protect the entire community. As Baytree homeowners and residents we are bound to comply with the Baytree Declaration of Covenants and Restrictions.

One common violation happening in our Baytree Community is that garage doors are open all day. Garage doors are permitted to be open when residents are working outside or inside the garage. Otherwise, garage doors should remain closed.

Closed garage doors prevent vandalism, varmint invasions, garage and car theft. Additionally, closed garage doors protect residents from easy home invasion. Its black racer season....you don't want one of these in your house! Approximately \$400 to extract and eliminate!!!!

It is best to look for them in the fall months near the masses of seaweed that wash up at that time of the year, especially after storms. There is a pretty active "seabeaning" community in Brevard so you will have some competition for the treasures. So, if you see people hunched over walking up near the weed line you will know what they are looking for!
